Let's look at our past year. We planted the seeds of Lionism in Soperton, although we could not get the two groups together to form a club this year. Time will tell.

Our membership goal was to increase district membership by 5 members. We lost two clubs this year, Wadley (6 members) and Brunswick (25 members). We have one year to re-establish a new club in Brunswick. As of today our district is down 70 members. We are hoping for a great push in June. The activation fee has been waived from June 7-30, so this is an excellent time for new members to join!

Preliminary planning has begun in Savannah and Statesboro for campus clubs. Also, we are considering restarting the Folkston club.

Your Governors worked really well together as a team this year. Each of the VDGs took leadership roles in a number of situations. We had several new young Zone Chairs who are showing great leadership potential in our district. We have also put together a new Global Action Team team for next year.

Our goal was to screen 25,000 children and we achieved 20,000. The good news is more clubs are buying vision screeners and the future looks encouraging.

18N held its convention in Pooler in February and we had a great time. We will always remember Miss 18N!

Our state convention was held in Helen, GA in May. It was a long drive for our members, but over 50 District N Lions made the trip. 3rd International Vice President Haynes Townsend was the keynote speaker and gave a heartfelt message. At the casino night a lucky Garden City Lion won big time!.

We have a strong PDG group that is looking to help our district to continue to move forward.

This has been one of the most special years of my life. Rosemary and I have been welcomed by clubs all across our district and we thank them for showing us some wonderful southern hospitality. I would encourage anyone to take this

journey.

Next year I have been asked to serve as Global Service Team Leader. I am honored to work with DGE Billy Carroll and his team. I will also be our district rep at the Lighthouse. These are my passions. I can't wait to share with clubs THE WONDERFUL WORLD OF SERVICE!

Dues Credits

Dear Club Officer,

Starting on June 30, 2018, dues credits for membership drops will not be issued after the release of the semi-annual billings on July 1 and January 1.

In the past, Lions Clubs International has given clubs a grace period in January and July to adjust their club rosters and receive a credit for unreported membership drops. This practice has been a courtesy extended to clubs by Lions International despite rules governing the practice in Board Policy. The board of directors recently decided that enforcement of existing policy is necessary in order to be in compliance with Board Policy.

Semi-annual dues are billed based on our records on January 1 and July 1 of each year. This means that clubs must update their membership rosters by June 30 and December 31 respectively to ensure they receive an accurate billing statement that reflects their club's membership. Members dropped after the release of the semi-annual dues billing will no longer be credited.

Here are a few best practices that can help you prepare for your July billing:

Update your club roster online using MyLCI .

Submit your updated membership roster to MyLCI or your local reporting system by June 30, 2018 CDT.

Inform current and incoming club leaders that membership dues credits will no longer be issued.


