4. SPECIAL

- A. International Visitors
 - a. ID Eugene "Gene" Polgar & Glad were the guests of 18-B for the District Convention the first weekend in March. It was held at the GLCB in Waycross, Ga. They were especially warm and inviting. ID Gene spoke at all functions, but he delivered a well received slide presentation at the banquet, which included some personal information about Glad being helped by Lions. Letter of Invitation and bio. material included.
 - b. PID's George Crumbley, John Pearce, and Myers Bannister were frequent visitors to special celebrations.
 - c. 3rd International VP Jim Ervin & Betty helped 18-B mark some special nights with their presence.

5. CLUB RECORD

- A. New Clubs Sponsored = Rincon-Springfield sponsored by Rincon Lions Club with 25 members. Charter Night Program included.
- B. Three-for-One Membership Drive Program initiated by DG at his official visit. He divided all clubs into 3-man teams, and inspired/motivated them into working on membership.
- C. Nomination Forms were distributed at the District Convention to be used by all there to list names, addresses, and bio. information about perspective members. The DG wrote each one of the names turned in, inviting them to the next meeting of the closest club. Approximately 6 clubs participated in this drive, with approx. 100 letters being sent. Lions have been encouraged to continue to make contact with these nominees. Perhaps 5% of the people contacted have become Lions thus far. This may pay off in the future.
- D. Retention: 103 new Lions were inducted; 94 Lions left 18-B clubs, including 23 deaths (71 quit, many in good standing). All but 3 clubs showed effort at working on membership. 20 of 48 clubs showed an increase. Another 7 remained even. Another 7 ended with (-1). The most severe loss was in the largest clubs that meet at noon, i.e. Waycross, Douglas, and Savannah (with a total loss of -31 for these 3 clubs). The remaining loss of 40 was divided between 11 clubs (9 of which have 26 or fewer members). All the efforts put forth this year will continue to pay off in the future.
- E. Ladies Nights: were held by many clubs, especially around the holidays.
- F. Special Programs: many clubs worked toward special projects, i.e. scholarships, etc. and have a special night for these awards.

DG's wife, Ann, for being a true Partner in Service, visiting 96% of the clubs, attending all Cabinet and District Mtgs., all State Mtgs., 3 other District's Conventions, numerous zone and region meetings, special nights & anniversaries, officer installations, & new member inductions; writing 2 articles on disability from the wife of the DG's point of view, and immeasurable help with the District Newsletter.
 - G. Lion Danny Fries, Rincon Lions Club, for being the Guiding Lion for the new Rincon-Springfield Lions Club.
 - H. PDG R.C. Cunningham, District 18-B Secretary, for boundless energy and enthusiasm while working all the way through surgery and serious illness.
 - I. PDG Roy Godwin, for all his time and talent as Chairman of the Paul Azinger Golf Tournament, and for making sure we had an excellent District 18-B Convention at the GLCB in Waycross. Lion Roy remains in the prayers of all, as he continues his battle with cancer.



HISTORY

1946	Lyons Lions Club was organized on December 17, 1946.
1947	Charter night was held on January 20, 1947 at the New Lyons Hotel in Lyons with J. D. Matheson being sworn in as Charter President of the club. Club pledged support for new High School and agreed to match any funds raised by the Kiwanis. A District wide meeting was held at the New Lyons Hotel with District Governor B. I. Thornton, several Deputy District Governors, and a large number of clubs from across the state in attendance. Club erected club signs at entrances to town and put on a minstrel show. Club pledged \$500 to help build a football field for the Lyons High School. The Club joined the Kiwanis Club in backing Merchant Dollar Days.
1948	Organized the school safety patrol in the local schools. Gave baskets of food to the needy at Christmas. Played a series of softball games with the Kiwanis Club.
1957-59	Club paid one third cost of Braille watch for a blind man. Provided many individuals with eyeglasses, donated \$60 for the local football team to attend summer training program and contrributed to the Georgia Lions Lighthouse.
1964	Club help finance and build the local swimming pool for the community providing many hours of volunteerism and funds to complete project.
1967-68	Completed payment on a \$1500.00 obligation to the Lyons- Toombs Youth Committee's swimming pool project. Club sponsored drive to place 65 US flags along the burial route of the city's first citizen to be killed in Vietnam War.
1976-77 .	Club continued with their flag project, sponsored a Gospel Sing netting \$960.00 and donated \$500 to the Lyons Public Library and the Lyons-Toombs Youth Committee.
1983-84	Sponsored fishing Rodeo in connection with the Lyons Tobacco Festival,
1985-86	Club held a road block for the GA Lions Camp for the Blind raising over \$1000.00 and sponsored a circus in town.
