Extension activity

Efforts were begun in the Spring of 1992 to organize a new Lion Club in the area known as Mountain Park in Swain County. The area lies along the coast lines of Swain & Wilkes Counties and generally between Highway US 29 E and US 178 E.

There was a Mountain Park Lion Club in the area from 1969 to 1973 when it was dissolved and its Charter surrendered.

Bethesda Club and Liltum Club were asked to sponsor the new Club, but both declined as they say they did not have the necessary strength to do so.

During the fall of 1992 and the winter and Spring of 1993, I have concentrated on the Mountain Park area, calling on Residents, Business leaders and managers, Governmental and professional people and any former Lion I can find, attempt

Efforts are being made to pay off — we
now had 3 members get together meetings
in the area. Attendance at these meetings
has only been fair, but I do believe
that it has helped to establish a
base to work from. Ansellville Lion
Club has agreed to sponsor the new
Club, and this in itself has been quite
helpful.

We now have 20 people who indicate
serious interest in a new Club, and of
these we now have completed enrollment cards
and money from 8.

I am concentrating on completing the
enrollment process as quickly as possible.
I expect an organizational meeting within
the next 10 days and to request a Charter
in mid June.

Elberta Lion Club indicates continued
interest in establishing a new Lion Club
at Danielsville Ga. However, I have
been unable to devote any time or effort
in that direction up until now. It
will follow things in this in Fall 1993
