Lieutenant Governor Charles E. McDaniels (Judy) of the Bonanza-Jonesboro Lions Club was elected District Governor by a Cabinet of his peers on March 10, 1990 in Thomaston, Georgia. Elected as Lieutenant Governor for 1990-91 was Lion Robert W. King of the Bonanza-Jonesboro Lions Club.

#### DISTRICT ORGANIZATION

The 52 Lions Clubs, 5 Lioness and 1 Leo Clubs were re-organized into four regions, each with an appointed Region Chairman. Each region with two zones, except Region III which has three zones, each with an appointed Zone Chairman.

#### MEMBERSHIP

Lions International reported the 6/31/90 membership at 1656 Lions in 52 Lions Clubs in District 18-E. In fact it was soon disclosed that two Lions Clubs had requested their charters be revoked and had not met as a Lions Club since: Newnan, 13 members, 10/89 and Cussetta, 12 members, 11/89. Therefore in effect we started with 50 Lions Clubs and 1631 Lions. All efforts to revive and reorganize Lions Clubs in Newnan and Cussetta were unsuccessful. The District records will officially reflect a net loss of 34 Lions (includes 29 by death) during the year. The charters of the Newnan and Cussetta Lions Clubs were cancelled by The International Association of Lions Clubs at their board meeting.

STATE CONVENTION

The 70th Annual State Convention was held in Gainesville, Georgia on May 17-19, 1991. Speaker was International Director Harold D. Keely from Centralia, Missouri.

District 18-E collected 11 State Awards on May 19th. Warner Robins--4; Macon Southside--4; Carrollton Noon--1; Warner Robins Lioness--1 plus one honorable mention. One International President's Leadership Award was presented to Lion Joseph A. Molony, Warner Robins Lions Club.

DISTRICT GOVERNORS TRAVELS

Governor McDaniels made 56 official visits to Lions, Lioness and Leo Clubs during the year, not including 23 visits to weak clubs, installations, guest speaker and Lions functions. The Governor also visited the Georgia Lions Camp for the Blind, the Georgia Lions Lighthouse, Georgia Eyebank and Leader Dog School in Rochester, Michigan. The Governor attended the USA-Canada Forum in Nashville, Tennessee, The "Lighthouse Day" with the Braves Game, International Conventions in St. Louis, Missouri and Brisbane, Australia, Zone meetings and Region Socials. The 20,800 miles traveled during the year does not include mileage to Nashville, Tennessee for the USA-Canada Forum. 16. Each Lions club apply for at least two State Awards, and one District Award.
17. Each Lion in District 18-E Accept the challenge to become a recipient of the "Order of the Golden Chain" Award.
18. Each club to emulate our District Slogan this year, "LIONISM IS LOVE". Share the Love of Lionism in all that we do.

OFFICIAL MINUTES OF CABINET MEETING

of District 18-E, Lions Clubs International, held on August 11, 1990, at Macon, Georgia. Meeting was called to order at 2:00 P.M., by District Governor, Charles E. McDaniels who acted as chairman, with 68 Lions and Lioness in attendance.

Minutes of Business Meeting

Pledge of Allegiance was given by LTG Robert W. King. Invocation by Lion Francis J. (Hank) Barks. Lion Joe Molony, Region IV Chairman, extended a warm welcome to the Lions attending the First Cabinet Meeting. DG McDaniels addressed the cabinet as the the District theme this year, "LIONISM IS LOVE". All Lions and Lioness were encouraged to share their Love of Lionism in all they do and to be proud to be a part of Lionistic service. DG McDaniels encouraged all lions and lioness to wear their lapel pin at all times when in the public view if possible.

Lion J. Cecil & Elsie Daniels expounded on the subject of Love, and shared their ideas on the subject. Lion Cecil and Elsie also expressed their desire of our District becoming more involved in the Peace Poster Contest Program, as well as the International Youth Exchange Program. Lion Cecil also announced that Lion W.C. (Clayton) Lancaster of the Forsyth Lions Club, was seriously ill, and asked that we keep him in our thoughts and prayers. Lion Elsie expressed her desire to share with members of the district particulars of the International Peace Poster Contest. DG McDaniels acknowledged all those who attended the International Convention, St. Louis, Mo.

Lion Jim Huskey presented a final Financial Statement of District 18-E for 1989-90. The final financial statement was approved as read by Motion--PDG Billy Wells, seconded by Lion Charles Parker, and unanimously approved by the cabinet.

DG Charles McDaniels introduced each member of the official cabinet of District 18-E for 1990-1991. Each cabinet member recieved their lapel pin of their respective office.

CS/T Judy Parham-McDaniels presented the proposed budget for District 18-E for 1990-1991, a motion was made by Lion Joe Molony, Region IV Chairman to accept the budget as presented and seconded by Lion Ed Gordon, President Bonanza Lions Club. During discussion, Lion Lloyd Britt, Secretary, Centerville Lions Club discussed the merits of the Lions Rebuilding Program and the funding amount of \$250.00 for this program. The proposed budget was subsequently approved unanimously by the cabinet. The additional \$1.50 per capita tax was also unanimously approved.

CS/T Judy Parham-McDaniels requested Fickling and Walker Insurance Agency of Macon be used to provided the Fidelity Bond for the CS/T for 1990-1991. A motion was made by Zone Chairman Louie Holmes, and seconded by Lion Jimmy Anderson to approve the request. The request was approved unanimously by the members present.

DG McDaniels acknowledged the importance of the timeliness of Monthly M & A Reports. DG McDaniels discussed the DG's Efficiency Contest and the "NEW" Point Tabulation Sheet. The DG's contest began 1 May 1990--and will end 30 April 1991.

DG McDaniels discussed the "SIGHT FIRST" Program in detail. Further that a video would be available on the subject.

DG McDaniels introduced Karla Gardner, Miss Georgia Lion 1990-91, of Macon Georgia. Ms. Gardner shared her enthusiasm of "Lionism is Love", and her heartfelt feelings of Love for the Lions of District 18-E. Ms. Gardner ended with a song "Love in Any Language".

PDG Jerry Payne submitted for nomination, Lion Louie Holmes, Macon-Southside Lions Club as a candidate for the office of Lieutenant Governor for 1991-1992.

DG McDaniels discussed the District 18-E Membership position as of June 30, 1990. DG McDaniels announced that the Newnan and Cussetta Lions had been placed on Status Quo as of August 1, 1990. Further that diligent efforts would be made effective immediately to attempt to revive these two clubs. DG McDaniels stated that we would have to make a decision within the next six months as to the ultimate fate of these two clubs. DG McDaniels stated that Newnan and Cussetta Lions Clubs will be first priority of the newly formed Membership/Retention Task Force for 1990-1991. DG McDaniels stated that he had purchased on behalf of District 18-E three videos from Lions International:

DON'T BE BLIND TO DIABETES---SIGHT FIRST---THE "WE SERVE" PEOPLE.

These videos will be available to any club upon request from their respective Region Chairman.

The Morrow Lioness Club was recognized for bringing their club banner and displaying it at the cabinet meeting. All clubs were encouraged to bring their banners to all District functions.

Lion Ron Crooks, Vice President, Georgia Lions Lighthouse Foundation, provided a report on the GLLF. 1989 Contributions from District 18-E were \$30,107, however the expenditures or services for District 18-E were \$59,968. Clubs in our District were encouraged to pay for eyeglasses on a club level and the Lighthouse would handle all major services. All clubs were encouraged to participate in The White Cane Day Program.

PDG Robert King, Vice President, Georgia Lions Camp for the Blind, thanked the lions of District 18-E for their support in 1989-90. VP King solicited the continued support of the Lions and Lioness of District 18-E in the upcoming year.

PDG Robert Young, Chairman of the Board of Trustees of Georgia Lions Eyebank provided a Report on the status of the Eyebank. PDG Young acknowledged the cooperative plan of the Lions of Georgia and the GLEB, Inc. PDG Young stated that VP Fao Akers would be available for programs in the District. PDG Young explained the Eyebank program and solicited our continued support of this worthwhile program.

DG McDaniels brought to the attention of the Cabinet Members the importance of reporting membership additions and deletions properly on the Monthly M & A Reports. The NAMES of the new or dropped Lions must be properly reflected on the M & A Report for Lions International to properly reflect your current membership.

DG McDaniels donated two boxes of Lions Mints in lieu of taking the time for a taitwister, donations were accepted for each roll of mints. \$51.00 was collected. A motion and second was made to donate the funds to the Georgia Academy for the Blind who made their facilities available for this meeting.

Lion Hank Barks, District 18-E Membership, Development & Retention Chairman gave an enthusiastic report. Although in the past years 18-E dropped in membership, in 1989-90 membership had increased. 1990-91, Membership, Development Retention is a priority. The development of the DG's Membership Task force, and the 100% commitment of each and every Lion and Lioness in 18-E, "WE WILL" have a steady increase in membership and fewer declines. The new member orientation programs are very important. Lion Hank along with the 18-E Cabinet and with the assistance of all PDG's of 18-E, will see that every new and existing Lion will be better informed Lions through a series of informative Orientations, and Lions information programs.

PDG Homer E. "Doc" Wright, Train The Trainer Program Chairman, provided a report on Leadership Development in 18-E. PDG Wright challenged all Lions and Lioness to be better Leaders, and to attend Leadership Seminars put on in 18-E when ever possible. PDG Wright pointed out that effective Leadership is "A KEY" factor in Membership and Retention.

Lion Gordon Haslett, District 18-E Sight Conservation and Work With The Blind Program Chairman, provided a report on the Georgia Radio Reading Service. This service is provided to the visually impaired. They read newspapers and magazines over the radio. Lion Haslett requested our support of this worthwhile project.

Lion Jimmy Anderson, Leaderdog Chairman, explained the Leader Dog Program and invited clubs to contact him for programs.

Lion John Dennis, Order of the Golden Chain District Chairman, described this new program for District 18-E. Lion Dennis said this program will help current Lions to become more involved and be more active Lions. Further, that this program will be extremely valuable in the Membership, Development and Retention Program as well. Lion Dennis welcomed the opportunity to put on a program and to be available to answer any questions concerning this new program.


