OFFICIAL MINUTES OF THE CABINET MEETING

of District 18-E, Lions Clubs International, held on December 1, 1990, at LaGrange, Georgia. Meeting was called to order at 2:00 P.M., by District Governor, Charles E. McDaniels who acted as Chairman, with 89 Lions, Lioness and guests in attendance.

MINUTES OF BUSINESS MEETING

Pledge of allegiance was led by LTG Robert W. King. Invocation was given by PDG Homer E. Wright. Region Chairman Joe Molony led in one verse of "God Bless America". 1st VP Chris Cleveland, LaGrange Noon Lions club extended a warm welcome to all attending the cabinet meeting. DG McDaniels acknowledged all guests in attendance: International Director Richard A. "Dick" Tyler, Past International Director W. Meyers Bannister, MD18 Council Chairman Chuck Wilson, DG Wayne Oneal 18-A, DG Bob Bovee 18-B, DG Terry Foreman 18-C, DG M.C. Stowe 18-D, DG Ben Poole 18-F, all PDG's of 18-E, PDG William G. Bross State Lion Tamer, and Past Council Chairman Jim Ervin, PDG 18-C. All First Time Attendees to the Cabinet Meeting were acknowledged.

International Director Tyler installed five (5) new members of the Columbus East Lions Club, Ricky Boren, Lane Brown, Nancy Brown, Allen McMullen, and Bobby Shackelford. LTG Bob King presented the minutes of the First Cabinet Meeting for approval. A motion made and seconded to approve the minutes as prepared. LTG Bob King presented a Financial Statement covering the period of July 1 - November 15, 1990, for approval, a motion was made and seconded and subsequently approved by the cabinet. PDG Billy Wells advised the cabinet members that PDG William Lovejoy Harwell had a stroke and wasn't doing very well, presently hospitalized. Get well cards can be sent to PDG W. DG McDaniels asked for a moment of silent prayer in memory of the eleven (11) Lions (two PDG's) who have passed away since the beginning of this Lions year. Region I Chairman Daniel Jackson gave report on Region I: Villa Rica raised \$1700 at their Gold Rush Days, Carrollton Noon raised \$12,000 on its annual light bulb sale (Commercial and Residential Sales). Heard County hosted a Region Social in Franklin, Georgia, fun had by all who attended. All clubs active in the Region.

Region II Chairman Lion John Dickens recently underwent surgery and could not attend this meeting. Zone Chairman Sam Preston gave report on Region II, Zone II. Average of 60% attendance at regular club meetings. -3 in membership year to date in zone. 75% of clubs participated in World Lions Service Day. 95% of club M & A reports on time. 23 Service activities. local clubs reported purchasing 20 pair of eyeglasses for needy recipients and \$1667 generated from fund raising efforts this period. Zone Chairman Harvey Nelson, Region II, Zone I reported all clubs doing well, newest club McIntosh had a recent fund raiser selling Lemonade. Riverdale now has six (6) female Lion members, McDonough hosting Region Social Dec. 10, 1990. Bonanza and the Morrow Lioness club recently participated in the Historical Jonesboro Fall Festival. Region III Chairman Bob Parker reported 15 clubs in Region with 339 members, -11 members year to date, however five (5) new members installed here today and two (2) to be installed at a later date in the Columbus East Lions club. Tallbotton had a successful BBQ, raised \$1600. All clubs active in fund raising activities. 20 all working hard to increase membership.

As the District Public Relations Chairman Lion Parker encouraged all clubs to have articles published in their local newspapers to let the public know of our Lions work. DG McDaniels introduced our District Bulletin Editor, Lion Ruth Chiodo, who is doing an excellent job with the bulletin. All clubs were encouraged to send articles to be published. Region IV Chairman Joe Holony reported that all clubs have been visited. Membership is a Priority in Region IV. Had a Joint Zone Meeting, hosted by the Macon Rutland Lions club. The guest speaker was PDG George Blackburn, MD18 Membership Chairman. Lion Ron Crooks, Vice President, Georgia Lions Lighthouse Foundation, reported that the Lighthouse has had to cut back on services, primarily the purchase of eyeglasses for those between 18-65 years old. District 18-E has contributed \$9,700 year to date, however during the same time period we have used \$10,575 in services. VP Crooks emphasized White Cane Day and its importance to the Lighthouse as a source of revenue. All clubs are encouraged to make plans for their White Cane Day Fund raising project. VP Crooks encouraged clubs to name a receipt for the Tom Bingham Fellowship award, \$500, such contributions will go to the trust fund of which the interest will be used to fund the Administrative services of the Lighthouse. VP Crooks advised that programs are available. DG McDaniels pointed out that all Region Chairmen have been provided with Video taped presentations of all four state projects, and are available as well to put on programs. Lion Fao Akers, Vice President, Georgia Lions Eye Bank, reported that programs are available, please call. VP Akers encouraged clubs to hold Eye Donor card drives in their community. VP Akers said this is an excellent source of Public Relations, and one of the primary sources of donated corneal tissue. VP Akers thanked Dr Mark Weiner for the excellent presentation on Corneal Transplantation, today at the Lions Orientation Program. DG McDaniels stated that District 18-E is leading the state in procurement of Eye donor cards, and encouraged more clubs to participate in this program. Lion Bill Craig, newly appointed District Leaderdog Chairman reported that only a few clubs in the District are contributing to this worthwhile program. 19 out of 50 clubs last year contributed to the Leaderdog program, so far this year 7 out of 50 clubs have contributed. Lion Craig stated that programs are available, and that club officers should go back to their clubs and insure that the Leaderdog program is in the clubs budget for this year. Lion Hank Barks, 18-E Membership, Development Chairman reported that Membership is the key to our success in generating more funds. More members, more projects, everybody wins. During the period of July 1-September 30, 1990 District 18-E has lost 31 members more than it has gained. Lions Orientation programs such as the one that was conducted today are the key to retaining the new members, as well as local club orientation programs. Club Membership committees are encouraged to be active and play a vital role in the club. All clubs are encouraged to have a 10% net increase in membership this year. DG McDaniels reminded the Cabinet Officers that "LIONISM IS LOVE", that as leaders we must set the example in our clubs and that our club image is very important. DG McDaniels encouraged Lions to wear their Lions Lapel pin proudly at all times, to invite your friends, business associates and "Partners in Service" to a Lions Club meeting as a guest. Share with them your enthusiasm, and your Love for Lionistic service. Share your Love of Humanitarian service with them, then give them the opportunity to serve as you do in the greatest of all, the largest "Service" Organization in the world, Lions International.

Lioness Doy Barks, 18-E Lioness Program Chair acknowledged and Thanked her guest speaker of todays Lioness/Ladies luncheon, Past District Lioness President Ruth Hurd from Florida and her guest Dot Meyers. Lioness Barks stated that all Five (5) Lioness clubs are very active and are supporting their sponsor clubs. Lioness Barks encouraged all Lions clubs to consider sponsoring a Lioness club in their community. All Lioness clubs participated in a World Lions Service Day Project, as well as craft fairs, lunch with Santa programs ect. Lioness Barks stated she was available for programs and to talk to clubs interested in learning more about organizing a Lioness club, which compliments and works well with their sponsor club. Lion Otis Hand, Leo chairman, reported that we have four Leo clubs, two active, two inactive. Seven (7) new Leo clubs are in the process of being formed at this time. Southwest H.S. Leo club turned in 125 pair of used eyeglasses today for recycling. Lion Hand stated our youth are the key to our success for the future. That many of our former Leos have gone on to be Commanders in the US Navy, have doctorate degrees, many have obtained scholarships. Our youth today are tomorrows leaders.

PID W. Meyers Bannister presented PDG Donald L. Norris with the International Presidents 100% District Governors award. PDG Norris thanked the Lions of District 18E for their support and dedication to Lionism last year. PDG Norris stated he recieved the award due to the collective efforts of all Lions and was proud of each of them.

PID Bannister introduced International Director Richard A. "Dick" Tyler who addressed the cabinet. Director Tyler thanked the Lions for their true southern hospitality shown to he and his lovely wife Joyce. Director Tyler stated he was impressed with the excellent Lions Orientation program today and that the key to Retention of our Lions is through Education and Orientation. Director Tyler acknowledged the presence of so many female Lions and Lioness, and stated our association is proud to have men and women serving the less fortunate as a team effort.

PDG (Past Council Chairman) Jim Ervin submitted for nomination, Lion Robert W. "Bob" King, Bonanza-Jonesboro Lions Club as a candidate for the office of District Governor for 1991-1992. PDG (President, PDG Association) Jerry Payne, submitted for nomination, Lion Joe Molony, Warner Robins Lions Club, as a candidate for the office of District Governor 1991-1992.

Lion Eldon Elzworth, LCIF Chairman presented a project "LITE" (Lions Independant Transitional Education). With the assistance of Lion Bill Tomlin, Manchester Lions Club, a slide presentation of the project was presented. The visually impaired of Georgia having gone through the Rehabilitation Services program at Warm Springs rehabilitation Institute, are offered the opportunity to go through the "LITE" cottage. This has been a Lions club project since 1976. The cottage was designed to teach and orient the visually impaired to living in their own home independantly. This cottage was dedicated by Past International President Frank Lyman in February 1979. The cottage is in need of repair and new equipment. At present only one visually impaired person can go through the cottage at a time. Approximately 53 visually impaired persons are served annually. There is a waiting list to go through the "LITE" program. The proposed plan is for District 18E clubs to adopt the program as a District project, and raise \$15,000 through fund raising efforts. Then to apply to LCIF for a matching grant of \$15,000. The Lions and Lioness of District 18E to do the renovation of this and possibly another cottage to put into service of the "LITE" program. DG McDaniels acknowledged having visited this facility and endorsed the program as worthy of District 18E clubs to support. A motion was made by Lion Paul Downs, Bonanza-Jonesboro Lions Club, and seconded by Lion Jack Fatum, Columbus Lions Club, to adopt this as a District project. Unanimously approved and accepted.

Lion Paul Earls, submitted for nomination PDG Homer E. "Doc" Wright, as a candidate for Vice President, Georgia Lions Camp for the Blind, for a two year term 1991-1993.

PDG Don Norris reported that the Fund Raising Fair is scheduled for January 19, 1991, in Thomaston Georgia. All fund raising vendors have been invited. All clubs are encouraged to bring information on there best fund raising project to share with other clubs in the District, lunch will be provided. All clubs were encouraged to attend and learn how to raise more money through fund raising efforts.

DG McDaniels thanked everyone for their attendance and their dedication to serving the less fortunate.

PDG Don Norris gave the benediction.

Meeting was adjourned at 4:38 PM.
