OFFICIAL MINUTES OF THE FOURTH CABINET MEETING of District 18-E, Lions Clubs International, held on June 1, 1991, at Columbus Georgia. Meeting was called to order at 2:10 p.m. by District Governor Charles E. McDaniels with 39 Lions, Lioness and guests in attendance.

Pledge of allegiance was led by LTG Robert W. King, followed by the invocation by PDG Homer E. Wright. PDG Wright also welcomed all in attendance to Columbus. DG McDaniels thanked PDG Wright, and Region III for hosting the meeting.

DG McDaniels acknowledged his travels to all the clubs in District 18-E this past year and shared several stories of the Humanitarian Service being performed by our Lion/Lioness Clubs. DG McDaniels said that "Lionism is Love" was practiced well this year in the District everywhere he visited. Our challenge now is to continue what we've begun and carry on a tradition of caring, loving and understanding of those in need as well as our Lions, Lioness and Leos who at times are also in need. DG McDaniels thanked all for their support and solicited their continued support for DG(E) Bob King in the upcoming year.

DG McDaniels recognized Lion William A. "Bill" Tomlin District 18-E Lions Independent Transitional Education "LITE" Program Chairman. Lion Tomlin received a Certificate of Appreciation and the DG Appreciation Award for his service this past year. Lion Tomlin reported having received in the past six months a total of \$7400, nearly half of the initial goal of \$15,000 needed to apply for the matching grant from LCIF.

DG McDaniels recognized the #1 Lioness Club in the DG Efficiency Contest for 1990-1991, The Warner Robins Lioness Club, accepting the award was Lioness President JoAnne Campbell.

DG McDaniels presented a 100% President Certificate and DG Appreciation Award to Lion President Forest Hobbs.

100% Lioness President Certificate and DG Appreciation Award to Lioness President Margie Grimsley.

Lion Ruth Chiodo was presented a Certificate of Appreciation and the DG's Appreciation Award, for outstanding service as 18-E Bulletin Editor.

Lion Jim Davis was recognized with a Certificate of Appreciation and Secretary Award.

A plaque for the HIGHEST "NET INCREASE IN MEMBERSHIP" was presented to THE WARNER ROBINS LIONS CLUB, accepting the award was Lion Joe Molony, Secretary.

The above awards were either unavailable or over looked at the State Convention.

CST Judy McDaniels provided a copy of the last cabinet meeting minutes to those in attendance. A motion was made by Lion Gene Lindsey and seconded by Lion Louie Holmes to accept the minutes as written. Motion was approved.

State Program - \$ 50,000 gral - Ferung Sept 91

CST Judy McDaniels provided a copy of the financial statement covering the period of March 1991 through May 31, 1991. A motion was made by Lion Lloyd Britt and seconded by Lion Paul Downs to accept the financial statement as written. Motion was passed unanamiously.

LIGHTHOUSE/V.P.Ron Crooks reported that District 18-E is doing a fine job on contributions to the Georgia Lions Lighthouse this year with contributions of \$35,505 from 37 Lions/Lioness Clubs, 18 of which participated in WHITE CANE DAY collecting a total of \$13,278. VP Crooks reported 18-E Clubs have used \$21,000 less in Lighthouse funds to date this year. This is reflective of many clubs purchasing eye glasses this year than referring to the Lighthouse. VP Crooks thanked the clubs for responding to the appeal by the Lighthouse. VP Crooks asked clubs to consider the TOM BINGHAM FELLOW AWARD and the TEN MILLION DOLLAR CLUB as forms of recognition in the upcoming club awards. DG McDaniels presented V.P. Crooks with a check for \$204 representing tailtwister fines from the State Convention.

CAMP FOR THE BLIND/V.P. Robert King thanked the Lions/Lioness of District 18-E for their support for the last 2 years he has served as VP. Contributions have increased in the third quarter of this year. The Paul Azinger Golf Tournament this year netted over \$28,000 for the camp. DG McDaniels presented V.P. King with checks totalling \$402 for the camp representing tailtwister fines from the State Convention.

MEMBERSHIP/DEVELOPMENT/RETENTION PROGRAM/Lion Hank Barks said that three years ago Lions International adopted a new membership program and we are not quite where we wanted to be at this time. WE'VE WORKED HARD IN THE PAST THREE YEARS TO PUT THE NEW MEMBERSHIP PROGRAM INTO EVERY CLUB IN OUR DISTRICT!! I know our governor and everyone who has come to each club has stressed membership. In April the Council of Governors saw fit to adopt a program of "20,000 members by the year 2000. What this means in District 18-E is by the year 2000 we need 3500 new members. This is work at the club level! DG McDaniels says "MEMBERSHIP IS EACH AND EVERYONES PERSONAL RESPONSIBILITY, TO FILL HIS OR HER SHOES TODAY WITH A NEW LION FOR TOMMORROW." There is no guarantee Lionism will be here tomorrow if we don't fill our shoes today.

TRAIN THE TRAINER/PDG Homer Wright reported that 55% of Region Chairman, Zone Chairman and incoming Presidents attended the Leadership development training. Let's do better this year! 20,000 by 2000 means a good membership increase, however it will take good leadership to keep them as Lions!!!

LEADER DOG/Lion Bill Craig asked if there were any checks? District Governor McDaniels presented Lion Craig with a check for \$104.00 representing tail twister fines from the State Convention. District 18-E contributions to the Leader Dog Program are the best they've been in the past three years. But we need to be #1 in sponsoring students, #1 in club contributions, #1 in providing dogs to the school, and #1 in providing support to receipients. District 18-E clubs sponsored two students in April. Thanks for your support and I'm looking forward to working with you in the upcoming year. We have collected over \$7200 for the Leader Dog program so far this year. Keep up the good work.

LITE PROJECT/Lion Bill Tomlin reported that he and DG McDaniels went to LaGrange last Friday where the LaGrange Noon Lions club presented a check for \$1001.00 (to top all clubs in the District) to the LITE PROJECT. District 18-E has done a terrific job on this District Project, established mid-year. Lion Tomlin advised that he was available for programs on the LITE PROJECT and that "we will" reach our goal of \$15,000, early in the upcoming year.

WIONESS CHAIRMAN/Lioness Doy Barks said "If I were a Tail Twister today, I would tail twist you good-District Governor McDaniels, because you introduced your wife Judy as Lion. And now to tell you why I would tail twist him, Lion Judy and Lion Charlie are also Lioness. Lioness Doy said we needed the support of the district to help sponsor new lioness clubs. "WE ARE A COMPLIMENT TO-NOT IN COMPETITION WITH THE LIONS CLUBS"! This year was a first for the Lioness to compete in the State level awards competition. District 18-E Lioness clubs won two State Awards and also an Honorable mention. District 18-E Lioness have also helped on all the state wide projects, both in manhours and contributions.

Region III Lion Bob Parker asked Lion Gladys Wright (Zone I Chairman) to give report. Lion Gladys said she was real proud of their region: 2700 pair of used eyeglasses and 47 hearing aids were given to Lighthouse. Membership is up 18 with losses of 7 members.

Region IV Lion Joe Molony was proud of his region, up in membership, five of his clubs were in the DG's top 10 clubs. Lion Joe said the best thing in his region was when District Governor McDaniels went to Crawford County Lions Club and spoke with the president and pulled the club together. In Crawford County there were several Lions that had not even been installed including the president. DG Charlie spoke at length and helped the club pull together. This club is now up in membership by 60% and attendance is now up to 95%. RC Joe said this was the biggest achievement in ou Region. 2C Louie Holmes mentioned Macon Rutland had a barbeque and raised \$23,000 for a family to help with medical expenses for their child.

DG McDaniels in his closing remarks said he was very proud of everyone and everything our district has done. Truth is being DG is alot of hard work—but the joys in your heart from having witnessed so many acts of Humanitarianism and the joys of sharing what Lionism is all about can never be replaced with money or anything else. The little things that the kids left in my heart at the Camp, I will remember forever. The elderly lady at Leader Dog who shared her story of how she went blind and how the Lions though the Leaderdog program have made her life worthwhile again, or the story of little Anna Maria which I shared on my Official visits to many of the clubs this past year. These and all the other memories you the Lions of District 18-E have given me, I will cherish. Thanks for allowing me to be your District Governor this year and giving me the opportunity to help you help the less fortunate.

DG McDaniels introduced DG (Elect) Robert King for a few closing comments.

Second Cabinet Meeting LaGrange , Georgia December 1,1990 (Continued)

Past International Director, W. Myers Bannister was present ofr this meeting, and he presented Past District Governor Donald Norris with the International President's 100 percent District Governor's Award.

Lion Eldon Elsworth, LCIF Chairman, discussed the" LITE" (Lions Independent Transactional Education) project. With the

assistance of Lion President Bill Tomlin, Manchester Lions Club, a slide presentation explaining the project was given. Briefly " LITE" works as follows: After visually impaired persons have gone through the Rehabilitation Services Program at Warms Springs, they are offered an opportunity to go through the "LITE COTTAGE". which is also located at Warms Springs. This project has already proved its worth and signifance. It

seems destined to be around for a long , long time.
This most promising project "LITE", was adopted as a District Project at this meeting.

District Governor's Annual Report

The best thing a historian can get into his hands is a good annual report, like the one DG Charles accomplished and sent to Lions International. He furnished your Librarian/Historian with a copy.

District 18E began the 1990-91 year with 52 Lions Clubs, 5 Lioness clubs, and 1 Leo Club.

Membership (Here we quote from the Governor's Report)

Lions International reported the 6/31/90 membership at 1656 Lions in 52 Lions Clubs in District 18E. In fact it was soon disclosed that two Lions Clubs had requested that their charters be revoked and had not met as a Lions Club since: Newnan 13 members, 10/89 and Cussetta, 12 members 11/89. Therefore, in effect we started with 50 Lions Clubs and 1631 Lions. All 3efforts to revive and reorganize Lions Clubs in Newnan and cussetta were unsuccessful. The District Records will officially reflect a net loss of 34 Lions(includes 29 by death) during the year. The charters of the Newnan and Cussetta Lions Clubs were cancelled by the International Association of Lions Clubs at their board meeting.
