Official Minutes of the Fourth Cabinet meeting of District 18E, Lions Club International, held on June 6, 1992 at Columbus, Ga. Meeting was called to order at 1:30 by District Governor Bob King with 32 Lions, Lioness in attendance. Pledge of allegiance was led by Lt. Gov. Elect Louie Holmes. Lion Jesus Valenquez, President of the Columbus Muscogee Lions Club gave a warm welcome. All first time attendees and Guests to the cabinet meeting were welcomed by District Governor Bob King.

A motion was made by Lloyd Britt, Centerville Lions and seconded that the minutes be approved as printed.

Cabinet Secretary Pat Gilman asked that the financial statement which everyone had a copy of be approved as printed - Motion made and seconded that it be accepted.

Lighthouse Report - VP Ron Crooks - Support for the Lighthouse has been excellent this year as far as Clubs picking up the tabs for eye glasses and eye exams for people over 18 and under 65. Total contributions are down \$6,400 less than last year. There are 16 clubs that contributed nothing to the Lighthouse. I feel this project should be supported since it is a statewide project and should be supported by all our Clubs. The Lighthouse operates under the regular contributions, memorial funds in honor of someone or an estate and White Cane. White Cane contributions can be done all year, not just once a year and these funds go into the operating funds. Advantage is that there is no administrative cost, 100% goes to sight and hearing operations and that's a plus. When people outside of Lionism donate you can tell them that their White Cane contributions gives 100% to sight and hearing services. Other contributions is the Tom Bingham Fellow. Total contributions \$33,600. Only two districts in the state exceeded last years contributions. If you want to honor someone, like your Club President or someone involved with the Lighthouse, the Tom Bingham Fellow Award is an ideal way to do it. You get a nice looking plaque for a \$500.00 contribution to the Lighthouse and it goes into the operating fund. The one requirement for the Tom Bingham award is you have to contribute more this year than you did last year in your regular Club contributions. The Ten Million Dollar Club was organized with the idea of getting ten million dollars in the trust fund for the Ga. Lions Lighthouse and the interest off of that would pay for the administrative costs of the Lighthouse. A membership, with a certificate being issued, is a nice way to honor an officer of your Club.

Golf passes were started this year. Charles McDaniels did an outstanding job with this.

Associate Directors should be appointed, send the mailing address, telephone numbers, etc. to him or the Lighthouse. July 25th there will be a seminar for all directors. Invitations will be mailed out.

Camp for the Blind - Lion Homer Wright - Camp session for the camp 1992 camping session - Session 1 - ages 10-13 - June 21 to July 4, Session 3 - ages 6-9 - July 19th thru 25th, Session 4 - Special needs July 26 thru August 1st, Session 5 - ages 14-17 - August 2 thru 15th.

Looking for a much more profitable year in the camping area. Last year we had a total of 168 blind and visually impaired campers. sponsorship is \$150.00 a week, \$300.00 - 2 week sessions. There have been a considerable number received already. Each camping season has a end of the session fun night and everyone should attend. Contributions are a marked improvement. Comparing 1992 to 1991, there are considerable differences between the contributions to the Lighthouse and the Camp but the camp is still growing and he also urged the Club President's to send in the names of the Associate Directors. The meetings are held in Perry. 100% of the Clubs named Associate Directors, however, not all the directors came to the meeting and the reason they are appointed Associate Director is to act as a liaison for the Club and the Camp for the Blind. There has been a considerable amount of upgrading of the Camp this year. long range planning committee had a Specialist that has been approved for upgrading the Camp. There has been a caretaker's house completed and there is now one being built for the grounds keeper. Cost for blocks are \$400.00 contribution, \$100.00 for bricks. Overall contributions are 90-91 - \$17,184.89, 91-92 - \$17,873.31. Lonnie Roberts is the incoming President for the Camp.

LITE - Eldon Elsworth - \$12,000 collected so far this year for LCIF. The new LCIF Chairman will be District Governor Bob King. LITE project has reached their official goal of \$15,000.00 in cash donations. Has applied for matching funds from LCIF, hope to be considered by October board meeting. A letter was received from International requesting more information. Prior to September any additional funds can be received and they will be put into the transitional quarters, kitchen & training facilities. Have donations in kind where we hope to get involved with a check swapping situation where one Company is donating \$3,000.00 worth of materials and another Company over \$2,000.00 worth of materials. We will swap a check for the same amount to buy this material. International will not allow us to accept handling this donation any other way. A news release has been prepared concerning the activities of the transitional living quarters. What's done in the past and what we are doing to renovate the program and it is going out to all AP Services. You might look into your local newspaper as there will be a picture of the blind person that has been helped with this program. He had a news release if anyone would like to see it. If anyone sees it in their paper, please send it to Bill Tomlin or Louie Holmes. They would be interested just what papers are printing this story. Basic construction is going on at the facility which is where the funds from Clubs go. New equipment will be funded when we receive the matching funds.

The Roosevelt Institute will continue the running and maintenance of the funds after completion. Day to day operation will be done by the Institute.

Leader Dog, Bill Craig-Total contribution is \$8,230.00 from 27 of 53 Lions & Lioness' Clubs (approx. 50%). There is still time to get your contributions in for this fiscal year. The Lions fiscal year does not end until June 30. Remember the use of a Leader Dog by a sight impaired person brings new challenges and opportunities to that person. Lions like you can make that happen.
