

OFFICIAL MINUTES OF THE THIRD CABINET MEETING,

King acknowledged guests: Bill Tanner, Council Chairman, Haynes Townsend DG District 18A, DG Chip Jernigan, District 18F, Jim Ervin PDG, Albany and PID Myers Bannister.

Cab. Sec. Gilman provided a copy of the last cabinet meeting minutes to all in attendance. A motion was made and seconded to accept the minutes as written. Motion was passed unanimously.

Cab. Sec. Gilman provided all in attendance with a copy of the financial statement covering the period to Feb. 20, 1992. A motion was made and seconded to accept the financial statement as written. Motion was passed unanimously.

Lighthouse report by Ron Crook - recognized all Lighthouse trustees, complimented the Clubs for handling eye glasses and that handling applications helps the Lighthouse tremendously. However, money is still needed.

- Reminded everyone that White Cane Day was coming up April 11.
- Checks received at the end of his report.

Membership by Don Norris - He has a package of information for membership that he is willing to share with any club that would like it. He said he was available to talk to any club concerning membership and we need to be really serious about membership if we are to meet our goal 20,000 by year 2000.

Camp for the Blind - Doy Barks gave this report in the absence of Homer Wright. Doy reported that Homer and Gladys Wright thanked everyone for the cards and prayers during his illness.

- Camp for the Blind contributions are down. But they feel that this will get better. Work weekends are March 20-23, May 1-3. You should contact the Director at the camp if anyone is interested in helping. They now have a tape for the Club if anyone is interested. At the Camp the kitchen has been renovated. A house is being painted for the Grounds Manager. This house was constructed in two weekends.

Leader Dog - Bill Craig reported Leader Dog is in good standing. He said that he was available for any clubs for a Leader Dog program and would be available to answer any questions at the end of the meeting. Regions standings are I - 16%, II - 6%, IV - 33%.

- Checks received at this time.

LCIF - Eldon Elsworth - He has been told that there will be 8 new Melvin Jones. 70 Lions are now MJF qualified. They have received \$10,000 to LCIF so far this year. Most people wait until the end of the year and he encouraged all clubs to give before April 30. On the Sight First program he encouraged everyone to read the Lions magazine about this program. In a discussion with Int. Director he received some good information. It is possible to submit an application for a grant to the LITE program. A discussion followed and a motion was made, voted on and passed unanimously that an application be submitted to International for LCIF grant to go into the LITE program.

Region I Chairman Charles Blackstock - said region alive and in good standing. He introduced Dave Knight - Zone Chairman who gave a report on all clubs. LaGrange club was recognized as being very involved with 125 members. Different community projects this club has been involved with were discussed.

Region II - Paul Downs report given.

Region III - Gladys Wright not present because of illness.

Region IV - Joe Molony - Report given. Recognized Zone Directors.

Jim Ervin PDG Albany invited everyone to attend the State Convention in Albany, May 15- 16- 17.

Remarks were given by Int. Director Roger Reichert.

At this time nomination Chairman Peter Peterson presented for Governor, Louie Holmes and Lt. Gov. Joe Molony. Charles McDaniels was nominated for Librarian and V.P. Lighthouse was Ron Crooks. Motions made and voted on and approved. Dist. Gov. Bob King said the fourth cabinet meeting will be June 6.

OFFICIAL MINUTES OF THE CABINET MEETING

of District 18-E, Lions Club International, held on July 13, 1991 at Macon, Georgia. Meeting was called to order at 2:00 P.M. by District Governor Bob King, who acted as Chairman with 61 Lions, Lioness and guests in attendance.

MINUTES OF BUSINESS MEETING

Incoming President and Secretary school was held 1:00-2:00.

District Governor Bob King welcomed everyone. The invocation was given by Lt. Gov. Louie Holmes. Pledge of Allegiance was led by Cabinet Secretary Pat Gilman.

District Governor Bob King apologized for the lateness of the Bulletin but this was caused by the time of the International Convention but he noted that because of the size of the crowd it appeared that everyone was aware of the meeting. He acknowledged first time members at the cabinet meeting, first time Presidents and Secretaries.

PDG Charles McDaniels gave his final report for the financial year 1990-1991. He thanked everyone for a good year. A copy of the financial statement was given to everyone. He entertained a motion that this be accepted as printed. Susan Hubbard made a motion, seconded by Paul Downs. Also a motion was asked to accept the last minutes, motion was made, seconded by Lion Blackstock. He also presented for candidate for Lt. Governor for 1992-1993 Joseph A. Molony from the Warner Robins Lions Club. Joseph Molony has had perfect attendance for 9 years, Region Chairman 100%, Region 4 served Zone 2 100%, District Tail Twister 1988-1991, Club Secretary, Bulletin Editor 1987-1991, Public Relations Chairman, Director Ga. Lions Lighthouse, on the Ten Million Dollar Club for the Lighthouse as well as Director for his own club, served Club Historia, Club President, Third Vice President 1982, attended USA/Canada Forum, 100% District State Convention.

District Governor Bob King entertained a motion that a Levy tax be approved of \$3.00 to cover additional expenses. The motion was made by PDG Charles McDaniels to accept the levy- seconded by Lion Blackstock.

Sect. Pat Gilman entertained a motion to accept the budget as printed. Motion made by Charles McDaniels and seconded Lion Blackstock.

Introduction of Cabinet was made by District Governor King: Lt. Governor Louie Holmes, Cabinet Secretary Pat Gilman, Bulletin Editor Ruth Chiodo, Region I Chairman Charles Blackstock, Region II Paul Downs, Region III Gladys Wright, Region 4 Joseph Molony.

The President of the Macon Rutland Club was acknowledged as being the host of the meeting. He welcomed everyone and stated that they started at having 24 members and now have 35. The fruit was with the compliments of Pres. Davis Centerville Club.

Camp for the Blind report by Lion Homer Wright was about the plans for the 15th Anniversary for the Camp July 27. Doy Barks also told about all the activities planned for this day and invited everyone to attend.

On the Lighthouse report Ron Crooks thanked all the clubs for the contributions received by the Lighthouse this year. More money was collected this year. More information will be coming out about some new procedures.

Jim Craig reported on the Leader Dog. He thanked all. This District for the first time in history finished in the top half of the State for the support of Leader Dog. He offered to go to any club that would like a program on Leader Dog. He will be visiting the Leader Dog School shortly.

Judy McDaniels said that White Cane this last year was a record year. Chairman was Becky Peterson. Received \$15,800 and there was 50% club participation. This coming year the goal is 100% participation. Help is needed by all the Lions, Lioness, Leo's. She also mentioned the good response that was had by the Joint effort of the Bonanza Lion's and Morrow Lioness Clubs.

LITE program/ USA/Canada Forum was presented by PDG Charles McDaniels. The Lite program started last year, \$15,000 was the goal for District 18-E. On report this is at a half way point. \$1,000 contribution from a foundation was received. He thanked everyone on behalf of Lion Bill Tomlin for everyone's support. He acknowledged everyone that attended the International Convention, the fun that was had by everyone and what was learnt about Lionism. He encouraged everyone that could to attend the USA/Canada Forum being held at Salt Lake City at the Embassy Suite Hotel Sept. 26-29. \$80.00 for room - includes room, breakfast and hospitality hour each day. Encouraged everyone to attend to learn more about Lionism that you cannot learn on a local level. District Governor Bob King commented about the Embassy Suite Hotel, that it was certainly worth the \$80.00 charge.

New Business - All Regional Chairman were asked to stay to meet with Lion Homer Wright after the meeting.

Sue Norris reported the Don was in Fla. with his father who had a stroke and on his behalf and several clubs she presented to PDG Charles McDaniels and Judy McDaniels plaques for appreciation of what they had done for Lionism and how they showed Lionism is Love.

Next cabinet meeting will be at the Warm Springs Medical Center December 7, 1991 - 2:00 clock. Lion Tomlin will be the host.

Directories were passed out for the Directors, Presidents and Secretaries of all clubs.

Susan Hubbard invited all members to the Morrow Lioness and Bonanza Lions Club Barbecue being held at the Morrow Pavilion July 20.

Cecil Daniels reported that he has Video on the Drug program available to anyone that would like to have it.

Charlie Blackstock suggested another person to be appointed to work with the four zones and 4 Regions for Conservation.

If there is an interest in receiving a Video of the Leader Dog program Bill Craig said he would be happy to pick up one for anyone.

Otis Hand asked for a sponsor for an athlete from the camp for the Blind who in all possibilities will be at the National Championship then going to Spain in the 1992 Special Olympics and will be on the Olympic Team.

District Governor suggested that all Region Chairman plan to sit at an incoming officers school between now and the end of September, and to advise him what scheduling was necessary.

A Melvin Jones recipient Wilford Cole who passed away was asked to be remembered in benediction.

PDG Charles McDaniels gave the Benediction.

Meeting was adjourned at 3:30 P.M.



LIONS CLUBS INTERNATIONAL DISTRICT 18-E ANNUAL REPORT 1992-93

Lieutenant Governor Louie F. Holmes of the Macon Southside Lions Club was elected District Governor at the third Cabinet meeting and District Convention February 29, 1992 in LaGrange, Georgia. Elected as Lieutenant Governor for 1992-93 was Lion Joseph A. Molony of the Warner Robins Lions Club.

DISTRICT ORGANIZATION

The district consists of 50 Lions clubs, 4 Lioness clubs, and 1 Leo club; Four regions, each with an appointed Region Chairman. Each region has 2 zones, except Region 3 which has three zones, each with an appointed Zone Chairman.

MEMBERSHIP

The extension efforts in District 18-E resulted in one new club being formed. The Houston Peaches Lions Club was chartered September 12, 1992 with 26 members. The Houston Peaches Lions Club was sponsored by the Warner Robins Lions Club.

Lions International reported 6/31/92 the membership was 1,562 in District 18-E's 50 Lions clubs. Three Lions clubs were on status quo as of 6/31/92: Columbus Evening Lions Club, 9 members - Lizella Lions Club, 9 members and Stockbridge Lions Club, 32 members, totaling 50 members. The charters of Columbus Evening, Lizella and Stockbridge Lions Clubs were cancelled by the International Association of Lions Clubs at their first board meeting in the 1992-93 year. The District records will reflect a net loss of 92 Lions (including 27 deaths) during the 1992-93 year.
