

#### District organization

District 18E, Georgia, is composed of 49 Lions clubs, three Lioness clubs and one Leo club, four regions, each of which has an appointed Region Chairman. Each region has two zones, except Region 3, which has three zones, each of which has an appointed Zone Chairman.

#### Membership

The extension efforts in District 18E resulted in one new club being formed. The Macon Evening Lions club's charter was approved by Lions International on February 7, 1994. District Governor Joseph A. Molony presented its charter on March 4, 1994, in ceremonies held in Macon. There were 22 new members and 12 transfers from the Macon Southside Community Lions club. The Macon Evening Lions club was sponsored by the Centerville Lions club. Largely through the efforts of past District Governor, Louie Holmes, the Macon Evening Lions club showed a net gain of 51 members at the close of the year, June 31, 1994.

Lions International reported that beginning July 1, 1993, there was a total of 1,461 members and 48 clubs. District 18E had a net gain of 27 members and a total of 1,489 members in 49 clubs as of June 31, 1994.

GA LIONS EYE TISSUE SERVICES State Chmn. Gene Lindsey had nothing new to report.

SightFirst Chmn. Charles McDaniels reported that MD18 raised \$680,000.00 for Campaign SightFirst last year, and of that amount District 18-E raised \$120,000.00. District Governor Daniels added that LCIF, from monies not designated for SightFirst, granted District 18-E \$5,000.00 for flood victims. Other Georgia Districts also received Flood Relief Funds from LCIF.

MEMBERSHIP AND RETENTION Chmn. Jim McMullen was not present. Lion Ron Crooks reported that Lion McMullen requests that every club send him (McMullen) the name of the Membership Chairman in your club.

EXTENSION CHAIRMAN Elsie Daniels is going to focus on starting new clubs. She has a video entitled "Help Wanted" available to all clubs or individuals. Lion Elsie enlisted volunteers.

ZONE I Chmn. Jack Felton said the flood has put a damper on Middle Georgia but he has been able to visit 2 clubs in Zone I. The first Zone meeting will be held in September in conjunction with a meal and door prizes. He requested clubs to host the zone meetings. (Written report enclosed)

ZONE II CHMN. John Dennis has been in contact with every club in his zone. He drove 75 miles to go 30 miles to one in Macon. He feels as good about this zone as he has ever felt just by standing on the sidelines looking. There are 233 members including 2 Lioness Clubs. Next meeting concerning the Perry National Fair Parade in Perry on October 8, 1994 will be 2 PM on August 14th. He would like as many clubs, Lions and Lionesses to participate as will in this parade. Lion Louie will wear a Lion suit and pass out candy to the children. Lion John said we need to make a great showing in this parade so people will know who we are without asking. (Written report enclosed)

REGION III Chair is vacant and the Governor is working on filling it.

ZONE I Chmn. Ron Crooks had everyone in Region III to stand. He stated that so far he has visited two of the four clubs in the zone. The Muscogee Lions Club has donated, by way of individual donations, over \$400.00 in brooms and mops to flood victims. They are crying for brooms and mops; it's something we sell, something your club can profit from and help the flood relief effort at the same time. Lion Jody stated that this is the first time he has attended anything outside of his club (he is practically a new Lion) and he is amazed at the enthusiasm he sees... ZONE III Chmn. Tom Porter's zone had four clubs contribute \$200.00 each for a total of \$400.00 for flood relief. His zone had a six member increase last year, a 7% growth.
