GEORGIA LIONS CAMP FOR THE BLIND VP Hank Barks requested that all clubs be sure they have correct information on Associate Directors. He said that he and Doye have visited several clubs this year. Donations are down a little in 93-94; \$15,000.00 was received. The goal for 94-95 is \$25,000.00. He said there are several ways to contribute to the Camp:

- 1. Century Club: Give \$100.00 to \$1,000.00 annually for which you will receive the Key Award and a medallion each year that you can put on the Key.
- 2. Buy building blocks for the caretaker's home @ \$400.00 each, and your club's name will be put on a symbolic block in the carport of that home.
- 3. The new C.A.M.P. Program of which more information is forthcoming. This program is for the purpose of cancelling some \$20,000.00 in outstanding debts.

INTERNATIONAL DIRECTOR HAZELBAKER SPEAKS

At this point Governor Daniels invited I.D. George Hazelbaker to say a few words. 1.D. George said he was just happy to be here - he feels welcome and is proud of P.I.D. Jim who stands a good chance to be elected and would make an excellent V.P. but he will have opposition. The state Lions will have to work hard and show complete support of P.I.D. JIM.

EYE TISSUE SERVICE Chmn. Gene Lindsay reported they are working with the Augusta unit to get an Eye Bank started. They still have checks coming for which they will use to work with this unit when everything is ironed out. State Lions are also working on a Children's Clinic for sight and hearing impaired children, to be presented for a vote at the next State Convention.

LEADER DOG Chmn. Dave Knight has given 4 programs the past quarter. He requested that clubs set him up for Leader Dog programs. There are no pending requests for a Leader Dog in 18-E. To date \$1,254.00 has been received from 18-E; last year \$7,800.00 was received. He would like for the District to fully sponsor one Leader Dog.

LIONESS CLUBS District Chmm. Judy Britt reported the District has 4, not 3, Lioness Clubs. She stated that we need Lions clubs to sponsor a Lioness Club. We need to get ladies involved in Lionism; either in Lions clubs or Lioness clubs. The Lioness clubs will have a luncheon at the next Cabinet meeting on February 25th.

MEMBERSHIP Chairman Jim McMullen is battling flu and pneumonia and could not attend this meeting. Jim's son reports that Jim is working with clubs on membership.

EXTENSION Governor Daniels stated that Lion Elsie is working very hard on identifying areas, and is making contacts in these areas, for new clubs in 18-E.

SightFirst Chairman Norman Rowe said the program is proceeding on schedule. The goal was reached in 1993-94.

JOURNEY FOR SIGHT Chairman Scott Bates said that this is a different type of program in that it is a program that can involve everyone in your community. His goal as chairman is to see 100% club participation in 18-E. Two ways to raise money with this project are marathons and walk-a-thons. He will be sending out information packets on Journey For Sight. Please promote this project through the media.

LEO Chairman Otis Hand encouraged forming Leo clubs for future Lion members.

L.C.I.F. Chairman Joe Molony asked that you call on him if you need a program on L.C.I.F. He also stated that if you need any information on the U.S.A./Canada Forum to get in touch with him.

YOUTH EXCHANGE Chairman James Rountree issued a plea for participation in this program. Last year Distrrict 18-E send three youths on the Exchange Program. He urged that you please mention the Youth Program in your bulletins.

After a ten minute break at this point, Council Chairman Buddy Ouzts spoke on redistricting. Clubs in 18-D,E and F will be affected. He recognized the members from the 5 Houston County clubs that will go to District 18-F. This re-districting has to be implemented by the Seoul Korea International Convention. He went into great detail explaining details of the re-districting and opened the floor for questions. Council Cham. Buddy said a bid had been submitted for the International Convention to be held in Atlanta in the year 2000.

REGION AND ZONE REPORTS:

REGION I Chmn. Lee Layton could not be present because of a business engagement.

Zone I Chmn. Don Rogers reported the Carrollton Club purchased a hearing device for a youngster who cannot use a regular hearing aid. Hogensville is still struggling but most paper work problems have been solved. The club has 7 members, 5 of whom have totally retired, but they will survive.

ZONE 2 Chairman Perry Amidon reported that Villa Rica club signed 9 new members, lost 2 and they are starting up a new Leo club hopefully by the first of the year. The Villa Rica club raised \$500.00 at the Gold Rush.

RESPON IV Chmn. Lloyd Britt reported that Zone 1 is down 2 members and Zone 2 is up 8 members. Region 4 has 454 Lion members and 34 Lioness members.

ZONE 2 Chairman John Dennis reported an 84% attendance rate in 22 clubs. Zone 2 lost 11 but gained 20 new members. All clubs in his zone have projects going on.

ZONE 1 Chmn. Jack Felton said his zone is losing 4 of the top ten clubs in the District. He has visited all the clubs in his zone since the flood and beat the September deadline. His 1st Zone meeting was hosted by the Macon Evening Lions Club and all clubs in the zone were represented except the Macon Club with a total of 29 in attendance.

REGION II Chairman Art Powell reported that Region II picked up 9 new members since the beginning of this Lions year, but lost 6 for a total gain of three new members. ZONE 1 Chairman Jerry Greenwell could not be present but he sent word by Lion Bill Cliff

that all clubs are working on projects and are serving the community.

ZONE 2 Chairman Bill Cliff reported that his Zone has 157 Lions, an increase of 6 since the beginning of this Lion year. Pike County had 5 new members and Senois had 3.

REGION III (This chair is vacant)

Minutes of Business Meeting.

The meeting was called to order at 2:20 PM by Gov. Cecil Daniels, who dedicated the meeting to Dr. Homer Wright and other deceased Lions this year. It was announced that the next cabinet meeting will be in Warm Springs, GA on June 3, 1995.

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Region 2 Chmn. Art Powell and the Invocation was given by Lion Elden Elzworth. Lion Loretta Snowden, Pres. of Pike County Lions Club welcomed everyone to Zebulon and brought to everyone's attention that this is the first meeting held in her club's newly renovated 'depot'. It took three years to restore the building, which was built in 1885. All the wood used in the restoration was old wood from historic buildings that the club purchased.

Covernor Cecil acknowledged the Barnesville Lamar Lions Club for their help with the meeting, then acknowledged all first time attendants present at the cabinet meeting.

At this point Gov. Cecil installed four new members: Joan Alstock and Teresa Hood into the Barnesville Lamar Club; Rocky Wainwright and Judy Thaxton into the Pike County Club.

Gov. Cecil named in alphabetical order the clubs with a plus in membership so far this year. All clubs will receive, for each club member present, 500 points for the first attendant and 100 for each attendant thereafter.

Joan Klonowski presented a program on the Paralympics (for the physically disabled). There are 4,000 athletes from 111 countries participating. The Paralympics will be held on the heels of the Olympics.

Elden Elzworth for Vice District Governor, Judy McDaniels for District Librarian and PDG Bob King to fill the unexpired term of Lion Hank Barks as V.P. of the Camp For The Blind. Lion Hank will be going to District F. The floor was opened for nominations at this point. PDG Chas. McDaniels made the motion the nominations be accepted by acclamation, Lion Art Powell seconded. The motion was carried.

DG Cecil encouraged clubs to install officers and submit PU101's and PU101M's.

Lion Daniels was State Convention Chairman for the Council that year. The Convention was held in Columbus, GA. Past District Governor, Louie Holmes was the Cabinet Secretary/Treasurer for the year. Many of the goals set for the District were met. The Convention was held on November 11-12 in Macon, GA.

International Director, George Hazelbaker and his wife, Ann were guests for the weekend.

18E was the first District to endorse the Candidancy of Jim Erwin for the position, 3rd Vice President of Lions International.

The top ten clubs for the District are 1st Bonanza; 2nd Macon Southside and 3rd Centerville.

The other top ten clubs are Columbus, Barnesville-Lamar, Warner Robin, Houston Peaches, Macon, Fort Valley and Riverdale.

The Tallapoosa club had many projects including a Golf Tournament, awarding Scholarships to worthy students in the amount of \$1200. The Tallapoosa Lions are responsible for bringing industry into the country. They erected a new building, 10,000 square feet, to attract new industry.
