MCG Eyebank VP Chuck Irvin, PDG, reported that since January 1993, 103 cornea transplants had been performed at the eye bank.

Lt Gov James Smith reported on membership activities. At May 31, District 18F had 968 members.

State Lion Tamer Bill Bross, PDG reported that the 1993-94 goal for White Cane is 100% club participation.

Lion Ben Poole provided a report on the Train the Trainer program. Lion Ben Poole also reported on membership, stating that the primary focus is on increasing membership in District 18F.

DG Irvin stated that a recent revision to the Lions club By-Laws provides for privileged members. In order to qualify, a Lion needs 15 years of service. This allows for flexible participation by older members while they are retained on the active membership roster.

PDG Coke Geddings provided a report on Campaign Sightfirst. He received contributions of \$50 from the Louisville club and \$1,000 from the Covington Lions club. PDG Irvin reported that Lion Ray Boyd had recently passed away.

Region I chair Lion Mac McClure reported that he had received no M&A report from Lincolnton since the beginning of the fiscal year and that several clubs had not filed October reports. As of the date of the meeting, the region is flat on membership.

Region II chair Paul Curl reported that Waynesboro club is currently in the organization stage. Sylvania has recently recorded 9 new members. Region III chair Lion Beverly Roberts reported that her region is down 15-

17 members but has recently elected 7 new members.

Zone 1 - 3,000 pairs of eye glasses were collected for the Lighthouse.

Region I chair Lion Mac McClure reported that the Covington club contributed \$250 to Lions International for Midwestern flood relief efforts.

The Washington club donated one dozen brooms and mops to Midwestern flood victims.

Region II chair Lion Tip Carroll reported that he still needs a Zone 1 chairman. Region II has recorded 7 new members.

Region III chair Lion Beverly Roberts asked representatives of District III clubs present to note directory changes and then recognized Zone chairpersons present. Zone 1 chair Lion Ed Shirley reported that he had visited every club in his Zone except the Garden City club. Zone 2 chair Bill Bross reported that clubs in his zone continue to do well. He will soon visit the Dearing club in order to ascertain the status of that club. The zone has lost one member this year. The second cabinet meeting was held on November 14, 1993 at the First United Methodist church in Covington, GA.

Pledge was led by Lion Richard Brown of the Covington Lions club and the invocation was delivered by Lion Chaplain John Rocks of the Covington club.

Lighthouse VP Ben Poole reported that the GA Health Foundation Annual Grant has been increased to \$50,000 from the previous \$20,000. \$30,000 has been collected from an estate in Winder. Lion Poole received \$1,900 in contributions.

Camp for the Blind VP Lion Bill Adair reported that the directors for the camp met last weekend. It was determined that the coordinating committee would be abolished and that the activities of the Executive committee would be delegated to the Executive Director of the camp. He also reported that the camp was experiencing a \$48,191 deficit and requested additional contributions from the clubs.

Leader Dog VP Lion Ed Menger reported that the Leader Dog program has received \$550 in contributions from district clubs this year. Also two residents of District 18F have received dogs, one in Augusta and one in Martinez.

Leo club District chair Lion Ken Gordon reported that there are only two Leo clubs in Georgia, Westside Leo club in Augusta and Southwest club in Macon.

State Lion Tamer Lion Bill Bross, PDG, reminded us that White Cane day is the second weekend in April. He stated that 18 clubs participated last year and raised a little over \$15,000.

Lion Bross stated that there is a three pin set this year for the state pin and that the set cost \$6 if you want to purchase all three of them.

Leader Dog chair Lion Ed Menger reported that \$425 has been donated so far this year.

Rules/Constitution/ByLaws chair Lion Rod Strader, PDG, requested that members be familiar with the existing constitutions and bylaws and abide by them.

Lion Ben Poole, PDG reported that the State awards are listed in the directory and that clubs must apply for these awards if they want to be considered.

Outstanding Blind award chair Lion J I Teasley encouraged the clubs to let him know if they have any possible recipients for this award. He reported that the deadline is in February.

Lions Quest chair Lion Bill Shurling, PDG, reported on the increase in drug usage and stated that drug awareness programs in the schools are just not effective.

Augusta Lions club President Lion Bill Revelle reported that the plans for the state convention in Augusta in May were on track.

Lighthouse VP Lion Ben Poole, PDG reported that donations from clubs are up.

Past DG Lion Ben Poole reported that there has been no change in membership. We have brought in 28 new members and we have dropped 28 members.

The Region and Zone chairmen present reported on the clubs in their areas. Lt Gov Carolyn Irvin encouraged clubs to submit articles to her for the state newspaper. The deadlines for publication are December 15, March 15, and June 15.

The third cabinet meeting of District 18F was held on March 27, 1993 at the Sheraton Hotel in Augusta, GA.

Pledge to the flag was led by Lion Carolyn Irvin, 18F Lt Gov; and the Invocation was delivered by Lion Emmitt Carroll, Zone chair and President, Wrens Lions club. We were led in singing by District chair and Song Leader Lion Ed Menger.
