

HISTORY OF DISTRICT 18-F

1995 - 1996

1. General Introductory Material

The implementation of redistricting District 18-F began with this Lions year. District 18-F went from 36 clubs to 56 clubs, three Lioness Clubs and three Leo Clubs. The territory increased by three counties--Walton, Decatur, and Houston. With this addition, we increased to 1350 in membership.

OFFICIAL MINUTES OF CABINET MEETING

of District 18F, Lions Clubs International, held on Saturday March 25, 1996 and Sunday May 26, 1996 at The Georgia State Convention, held at Hapeville, Georgia, U.S.A.

Meeting was called to order at 7:30 A.M. by District Governor Dr. Beverly A. Roberts who acted as chairperson.

Cabinet roll call is at enclosure 1.

Agenda is attached as enclosure 2.

This is the fourth cabinet meeting of Lions year 1995-1996 for Governor Beverly A. Roberts.

Pledge to the Flag was lead by Zone Chairman Lion Ann Stump, North DeKalb Lions Club. The Invocation was delivered by District Governor Elect Tom Rippy, Covington Lions Club.

District Governor Beverly A. Roberts introduced Past International Director, Jim Ervin and Judge Howard L. Patterson, Jr., Second Vice President, Lions Clubs International.

Cabinet Secretary Edward Shirley distributed copies of the minutes of the last cabinet meeting. A motion was made and seconded to dispense with the reading of the minutes and approve them as written. Motion Carried.

The Treasurer's report was given by Cabinet Treasurer Jon Winters. A motion was made and seconded to approve the report as given. Motion carried.

Vice Governor Tom A. Rippy, Covington Lions Club, thanked everyone for their support this last year and is looking forward to his term as District Governor. He introduced Vice District Governor Elect Robert Yonchak, Louisville Lions Club, Cabinet Secretary, Richard Brown, Covington Lions Club, and treasurer James D. Williams, Covington Lions Club. He said he had tickets for the breakfast on July 11, 1996 at Montreal. These are not included in the packet and everyone should try to attend this breakfast as this is where all the candidates will do their campaigning.

REGION CHAIRMEN REPORTS:

Region Chairman Lion Bill Worrell, Laurel Ridge Lions Club, gave the report for Region I. He said we had a net gain of two members for the year. Fund raising went very well with \$55,795.00 going to the various Lions sponsored projects. All Zone meetings were held with very good attendance. One of the highlights of the year was providing a Spaghetti Dinner for the Regina, Saskatchewan Canada Lions Band, on a stopover on the way to the Orange Bowl Parade in Miami. Seven clubs from all three zones participated. During the year 11,129 used eye glasses and 58 used hearing aids were collected and turned in to the Lighthouse.

Region Chairman, Lion Robert Yonchak, Louisville Lions Club, gave a report for Region II. He stated that they had a good year but loss several members through death. They turned in a lot of used eye glasses and gave money to the various Lions sponsored projects. He thanked his zone charimen for their support this last year.

Region Chairman Lion Jimmy Newman, Fleming Lions Club, gave a report for Region III. He said that the Region had a net gain of 23 members. We lost one club but gained the Thomson Camellia City Lions Club. Zone I had two zone meetings and Zone II had three zone meeting with one of them being combined with a social.

Region Chairman Lion Lloyd Britt, Centerville Lions Club, gave a report for Region IV. He said that there are fourteen Lions and one Lioness Clubs in Region IV. There has been a drop of 12 Lions and an increase of one Lioness. He said he had visited all the clubs in Region IV, and attended five zone meetings this year. The clubs have given over \$28,900 in donations to various organizations, They have provided eye exams for 88 persons, purchased eye glasses for 98 persons and hearing aids for six persons. This region had a 100% M&A reporting for the year.

State Lion Tamer Bill Bross, Thomson Lions Club, gave a report on White Cane Day. He said White Cane Day was very successful. We had the best year we have ever had. Thirty-three of the 55 clubs participated in White Cane Day. The Thomson Lions Club collect \$26,993.01 for first place. The Jones County Lions Club came in second and the Hephzibah Lions Club came in third.

DISTRICT CHARIMAN REPORTS:

PDG Carolyn Irvin, Vice President to the Georgia Lions Lighthouse, gave a report on the Georgia Lions Lighthouse. She said we furnished 2,225 Georgians in 146 counties with vision and hearing care. She gave out certificates to the Clubs that had made major contributions to the Lighthouse.

District Leader Dog Chairman Lion Ed Menger gave a report on Leader Dog. He said that we have two people with leader dogs that work with the Leader Dog Program. We have 40 clubs that have given to Leader Dog. He offered to visit the clubs to talk about the Leader Dog Program.

Past District Governor Lion Bill Shurling, Thomson Lions Club, said he wanted to thank everyone for the two awards he received last year as District Governor. He said a lot of clubs had donated \$100.00 to the Jim Ervin Campaign Fund, but we need to raise \$10,000.00. He said he had raffle tickets for a pick up truck that will be given away at the first cabinet meeting in District B. He said he did not have anything more to report on the International Convention.

Vice President to the Children's Eye Care Center and State Historian Olin Newby, Washington Lions Club, gave a report on the Children's Eye Care Center. He said that progress is being made and they need money to buy new equipment. He urged every club to donate to the Children's Eye Care Center.

District Governor Elect Tom Rippy, Covington Lions Club, said that September 26 through September 29, 1996, will be the USA/Canada Forum. It will be held in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, this year. He urged everyone to make their reservations early. He also announced that District Governor Beverly A. Roberts was elected State Council Chairman for next year.

District Governor Beverly A. Roberts reminded everyone that the parade in Montreal will start at 9:30 a.m. on July 9, 1996. We will be 44th in line.

PDB William A. Bross, said that he had 500 pins with Jim Ervin's picture on them and; if he sells them all, he will give \$400.00 profit to the Jim Ervin Campaign Fund.

Meeting recessed until Sunday Morning May 26, 1996.

Meeting was called to order at 7:30 a.m. by District Governor Dr. Beverly A. Roberts who acted as chairperson. The pledge to the Flag was lead by Lion Gene Lindsay, Warner Robins Lions Club. The Invocation was delivered by Lion Ray Howard, Covington Lions Club.

Lion Bill Craig, State Leader Dog Representative, introduced Bill Hadden, Leader Dog Field Representative. He brought greetings from Leader Dog and stated that District 18F had contributed more to Leader Dog than any other district in Georgia.

Lion Hank Barks, Vice President to the Camp for the Blind, gave a report on the Camp and gave out certificates of appreciation from The Camp, to all the clubs that had given at least \$10.00 for each member and banner patches for clubs who had given over \$25.00 a member. He gave plaques to the Milledgville Lions Club and the Centerville Lioness Club.

MCS Eye Bank Representative Lion Gerald Foreman, Forest Hills Lions Club said that the Eye Bank had purchased a Fax machine for their Eye Bank Coordinator and that made her work much easier. He said that from January 1 through May 15, 1996 the Richmond County Department of Family and Children's Services had received 124 applications for assistance in eye care service.
