To complete the application process, please submit **EACH** of the following three items:

- Completed application form with the requested statement of purpose
- An outline of your Lion's activities and/or participation since joining a Lions club
- The Nomination Form completed by a Lion Leader nominating you to attend the Institute

This letter of reference should include how long the nominator has known the applicant and in what capacity, an assessment of the applicant's desire to develop leadership skills and willingness to work diligently and cooperatively at the Institute, potential for using the developed leadership skills in the applicant's club or district, an assessment of the need for the Institute and benefit of the Institute to the applicant, and the writer's demographic information; such as, name, address, phone, fax, club name and location, and e-mail.

#### COST OF THE INSTITUTE

The Institute fee is \$110.00. The fee must be paid by check or money order made payable to the Lions of North Carolina and included with the application.

Institute materials, including any notebooks and handouts used in the Institute activities, will be furnished. The Institute will pay for your lodging on April 14, 15, and 16; lunch and dinner on April 14, three meals on April 15 and 16, and breakfast and lunch on April 17; and snacks on April 15 and 16.

Lodging rooms will be double occupancy. The fee is non-refundable; however, should you not be selected, your money will be refunded by May 15, 2005.
